Agency Requests:								
1. Security Upgrades to Agency's Identity and Access Management Services (Information Resources Program). The agency requests \$215,000 in General Revenue to implement commercial identity management solutions to protect the confidentiality of data. THECB manages applications providing student loan processing, collections and administration of reports from higher education institutions, management of loan repayment programs, and outreach to prospective higher education students. This includes loan repayment programs, grant programs, and many other agency applications that are integrated into a agency developed authentication system (CBID). A commercial identity management system would replace the agency developed CBID application. The request includes one-time expenditures totaling \$80,000 to cover initial configuration and one-time fees in FY 2018 and annual costs of \$67,500 in FY 2018 and FY 2019 to cover annual licensing and other recurring service-based costs. 2.	Agency Cybersecurity Improvements and Managed Security Services (Information Resources Program). The agency requests \$225,000 in General Revenue to fund cybersecurity and professional services to address information security at the agency. The request would fund the cost of information security initiatives and professional services by providing services to address vulnerability management, application security, security incident & event management (SIEM), and participation in cloud-based managed security services. The request includes two one time costs in FY 2018, \$10,000 for implementation services to provide security services and \$75,000 to acquire hardware for security incident and event management. 3.	Texas Grant Program. The exceptional item request, in addition to the 2018-19 base line request, \$715 million, would support approximately 85 percent of eligible students under current eligibility requirements and a \$5,000 targeted award amount. The agency reports that it will be requesting legislative changes to TEXAS Grant eligibility. The agency's original exceptional item request was \$78.3 million. 4.	Advise Texas CAC. The agency requests \$4.0 million in General Revenue as an exceptional item for the Advise Texas program. The Advise Texas places recent university graduates on high school campuses as near-peer college advisors. Advise Texas advisors receive training before serving in a high school, completing a four-six week practical curriculum that focuses on college access, college admissions, financial aid, student services, diversity community service and professionalism. The exceptional item request seeks to provide funding for an additional 80-100 advisors (totaling up to 210) in high schools across Texas. House Bill 1 funding is \$4 million in General Revenue which maintains 2016-17 funding levels. 5.	Fields of Study (Academic Quality and Workforce Program). Fields of Study (FOS) facilitate the applicability of courses transferred from community colleges to universities by establishing a set of lower division courses within a discipline that must be applied to a bachelor's degree in that discipline. FOS are 12 to 18 semester credit hours that complement the 42 hour Core Curriculum. The agency reports existing FOS need to be revised, the voluntary transfer compacts need to be transformed into FOS, and new ones need to be created. The request will provide the personnel (2 FTES) for the agency to manage the process and the funds to facilitate the faculty and institutional participation necessary to created a viable product. The funding would allow the THECB to conduct 28-32 meetings per year for approximately 6-8 academic fields. - 1. On page III-63 of House Bill 1 – Introduced, within the Higher Education Coordinating Board’s bill pattern, modify the following rider.

Capital Budget. Out of the funds appropriated above in Strategy E.1.10, Bilingual Education Program, the Coordinating Board shall expend an amount that is not less than \$150,000 for each year of the ~~2016-17~~2018-19 biennium to develop and operate a program at the University of North Texas, University of North Texas at Dallas, Texas Woman’s University, The University of Texas at Dallas, The University of Texas Arlington, Texas A&M Commerce and DFW Tech Teach - Texas Tech University, in consultation with the university, to provide financial incentives in the form of tuition assistance, to encourage students who enroll in an educator preparation program at the university to become certified to teach bilingual education, English as a Second Language, or Spanish in school districts with high critical needs.

The program shall make awards to qualified students admitted to the Teacher Education Program in Bilingual Education. Qualified students must: 1) have demonstrated financial need, as determined by the completion of a Free Application for Federal Student Aid form and the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships; 2) Successfully pass the State Board of Educator Certification Bilingual Target Language Proficiency Test; and 3) Maintain a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA. The program shall submit a report not later than January 1, 2019 to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board detailing annual information on the following performance measures:

- Student graduation rates from the program;
- Passage rates for the Texas Examination of Education Standards Bilingual Education Supplemental exam and/or the English as a Second Language Supplemental exam; and Graduate employment data at Texas public school districts.

Limitation of Nonresident enrollment in Certain State-supported Professional Schools

Overview

The following action would allow The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston to admit up to 25 competitively recruited medical students for a specialized program of clinical and research training irrespective of whether those students are Texas residents.

Required Action

On page III-255 of House Bill 1 – Introduced, in Special Provisions Relating Only to State Agencies of Higher Education, amend the following rider:

Sec. 13. Limitation of Nonresident Enrollment in Certain State-supported Professional Schools.

1. None of the funds appropriated by this Act may be expended for the establishment, operation, or maintenance, or for the payment of any salaries to the employees in, any wholly or partially state-supported medical, dental, or law school which: (a) imposes a limitation on the number of students that it admits, (b) in an academic semester denies admission to one or more Texas residents who apply for admission and who reasonably demonstrate that they are probably capable of doing the quality of work that is necessary to obtain the usual degree awarded by such school, and (c) in the same academic semester admits, as either class, nonresidents of the State of Texas in a number greater than 10 percent of the class of which such nonresidents are a part. Limitation of nonresident enrollment at The University of Texas Law School, Texas Tech University School of Law, and the University of Houston Law Center may be increased to 35 percent of the class of which nonresidents are a part provided that the admission of such nonresident students is on the basis of academic merit alone. By the provisions of this paragraph it is intended to withhold funds appropriated by this Act from state-supported medical, dental, and law schools which limit their enrollments and which fill more than 10 percent of their classes with non-resident students in the case of medical and dental schools, and 35 percent in the case of The University of Texas Law School, Texas Tech University Law School, and the University of Houston Law Center, when the result of admitting a nonresident denies admission to a qualified Texas applicant. This provision shall not apply to the funds appropriated to the Coordinating Board for the funding of Baylor College of Medicine or to funds appropriated for tuition equalization grants for students attending private colleges.
2. In addition, The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center may admit up to 25 competitively recruited medical students in each entering class for a specialized six-year program of clinical and research training designed to lead to the MD and PhD degrees irrespective of whether those students are Texas residents.
3. Texas medical schools may enroll up to 6 competitively recruited medical students, who already possess the DDS degree, in each second year medical school class for a specialized six-year program in oral and maxillofacial surgery comprised of the last three years of medical school and a three year residency program irrespective of whether those students are Texas residents.
4. The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston may admit up to 25 competitively recruited medical students in each entering class for a specialized program

of clinical and research training designed to lead to the MD and PhD degrees irrespective of whether those students are Texas residents.

Modify Sec. 46, Report Concerning Designated Tuition, to correct the academic years in the reporting requirement.

Required Action

On page III-265 of House Bill 1 – Introduced, in Special Provisions Relating Only to State Agencies of Higher Education, amend the following rider:

Sec. 46. Report Concerning Designated Tuition.

- (a) Not later than January 1, 2018, the governing board of each public institution of higher education that charges students designated tuition under §54.0513, Education Code, shall use the appropriations in the Act to report to the legislature, for the 2015-16 and ~~2016-17~~2017-18 academic years:
- (1) the amount the institution has collected in designated tuition;

(2) the purposes for which the institution spent the money derived from designated tuition and the amount of that money spent for each of those purposes; and

(3) the amount set aside from designated tuition for resident undergraduate and graduate student assistance under §§56.011 and 56.012, Education Code and how these amounts are allocated under the following categories.
- (a) grants

(b) scholarships,

(c) work-study programs,

(d) students loans,

(e) and student loan repayment assistance.
- (b) Reports required by this section shall be delivered to the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House, the chair of the Senate Finance Committee, and the chair of the House Appropriations Committee.
