Continuation of STAR Health Services for Adopted Foster Children

Overview

The following action adds a new rider that directs \$ for the continuation of STAR health services for adopted foster children.

During children's time in foster care in Texas, they may experience several placements, which can often lead to inconsistent and disjointed medical and behavioral health care. This challenge can continue once a child is adopted by a relative or licensed foster parent. Children in care frequently lose access to the medical providers while in state custody because the Medicaid provider, STAR Health, terminates the child's health coverage on the last day of the month they were adopted, which forces adoptive parents to seek medical and behavioral health care through another insurance provider. SB 1493 seeks to remedy this gap in coverage by allowing adoptive parents the opportunity to continue the health care coverage provided by STAR Medicaid.

Health and Human Services Commission Contingent Rider for SB 2138

Overview

The following action adds a new rider that would allow HHSC to spend funds retained to support the administration of the supplemental payment program.

Supplemental payments are payments above the contracted fee-for-service rates paid by the state or a managed care plan to certain providers that serve Medicaid patients such as hospitals and nursing homes. HHSC supports numerous supplemental payment programs but retains funds to administer only a few of these programs such as the School Health and Related Services (SHARS) program and Delivery System Reform Incentive Program (DSRIP). For the remaining programs, general revenue dollars are used to fund the state share of administrative costs of operating the remaining programs. SB 2138 would allow HHSC to retain of a portion of a participating entities' payments to administer the supplemental payment programs. This will allow the agency to provide greater oversight, make more timely payments, engage more regularly with participating entities, and evaluate changing funding mechanisms. There is no cost to GR as a result of this rider, only the authorizing to spend retained funds.
