



LEGISLATIVE BUDGET BOARD Senate Bill 30 – Highlights

SAVINGS RELATED TO SB30

Fiscal year 2023 supplemental appropriations in Senate Bill 30 total **\$5,006.7 million in General Revenue Funds and \$11,852.3 million in All Funds**. After consideration of these supplemental appropriations, remaining 2022–23 biennial General Revenue Funds capacity subject to the tax spending limit is \$5.6 million.

Appropriations include \$1,445.3 million in Federal Funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), leaving \$3,954.7 million in remaining ARPA funding.

(\$8,207.0 MILLION) <hr/> GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	FOUNDATION SCHOOL PROGRAM ADJUSTMENT Texas Education Agency The bill reduces General Revenue Fund appropriations to the Texas Education Agency from the Foundation School Fund No. 193 by \$8.2 billion resulting from updated projections since the appropriations were passed by the Eighty-seventh Legislature, 2021. The net savings results primarily from increased District Property Value growth, lower-than-anticipated average daily attendance, and increased non-General Revenue Funds revenues.
\$3,861.6 MILLION) <hr/> GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	CUSTOMER RATE RELIEF BONDS Texas Public Finance Authority The bill provides an estimated \$3.9 billion in General Revenue Funds to the Texas Public Finance Authority to pay the aggregate customer rate relief charges on behalf of customers in lieu of monthly charges to assist with recovery from the effects of Winter Storm Uri, February 2021, contingent on legislation authorizing the grant.

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\$26.8 MILLION	OPIOID ABATEMENT TRUST FUND TRANSFER Comptroller of Public Accounts
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides \$26.8 million in General Revenue Funds from the McKinsey lawsuit settlement proceeds to the Opioid Abatement Trust Fund for the abatement of opioid-related harms, pursuant to the Texas Government Code, Section 403.507(b)(2).

\$25.0 MILLION	FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER INCUBATOR PROGRAM Department of State Health Services
FEDERAL FUNDS (ARPA)	The bill provides \$25.0 million in Federal Funds from ARPA to the Department of State Health Services for the Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) incubator program, which provides seed money to FQHCs to expand into new services lines or to start a new FQHC in an under-resourced area.

\$24.5 MILLION	DISASTER RESILIENCY INFRASTRUCTURE Lamar Universities
FEDERAL FUNDS (ARPA)	The bill provides \$24.5 million in Federal Funds from ARPA to Lamar University (\$10.0 million), Lamar State College – Port Arthur (\$4.0 million), Lamar Institute of Technology (\$4.0 million), and Lamar State College – Orange (\$6.5 million) for disaster resiliency infrastructure.

\$23.8 MILLION	DEFERRED MAINTENANCE FOR SECURITY PROJECTS Texas Department of Criminal Justice
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides \$23.8 million in General Revenue Funds to TDCJ to fund deferred maintenance for security projects.

\$12.6 MILLION	FOSTER CARE Department of Family and Protective Services
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides \$12.6 million in General Revenue Funds to the Department of Family and Protective Services to fill a Foster Care shortfall.

\$9.7 MILLION	REIMBURSEMENT TO COUNTIES Texas Juvenile Justice Department
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides \$9.7 million in General Revenue Funds to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department to reimburse counties for juveniles awaiting transfer to state facilities.

\$8.0 MILLION	TEXAS MEMORIAL MUSEUM University of Texas
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides \$8.0 million in General Revenue Funds to the University of Texas for renovations to the Texas Memorial Museum.

\$10.6 MILLION	OTHER ITEMS
GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS	The bill provides additional appropriations including \$3.8 million from General Revenue–Dedicated Account No. 550, Hazardous and Solid Waste Remediation Fee, to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for site remediation and clean-ups; \$3.0 million in General Revenue Funds to the State Preservation Board for maintenance of the Texas State History Museum; \$1.5 million in General Revenue Funds to the Texas Water Development Board for data center services; \$0.9 million in General Revenue Funds to the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired to address an operating shortfall; \$0.6 million in General Revenue Funds to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice to support a vocational training program; \$0.5 million in General Revenue Funds to the Railroad Commission of Texas to comply with rule changes adopted by the federal Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration; and \$0.3 million in General Revenue Funds to the Department of Family and Protective Services for Children’s Advocacy Centers Information Technology costs.

(\$218.5 MILLION)	OTHER ITEMS
ALL FUNDS	The bill provides savings of \$18.5 million in General Revenue Funds to the Texas Facilities Commission for General Obligation bond debt service and reduces \$200.0 million in Federal Funds from ARPA appropriations made in Senate Bill 8, Eighty-seventh Legislature, Third Called Session, 2021, to the Department of Information Resources for cybersecurity projects. The bill also provides unexpended balance authority for certain appropriations in supplemental appropriation bills passed by the Eighty-seventh Legislature, 2021.
