For the Quarter 2 FY 2025 reporting period, LBB staff asked agencies for additional detail about the balance of unexpended funds for each award. Of the \$2,478,423,571 in unexpended funds for this authority, agencies report that \$84,069,232 has lapsed and is unavailable for expenditure. Agencies report that \$2,238,394,705 have been obligated, but not yet expended, and a total of \$155,959,634 remains available for obligation and expenditure.
