For the Quarter 1 FY 2026 reporting period, LBB staff asked agencies for additional detail about the balance of unexpended funds for each award. Of the \$325,036,782 in unexpended funds for this authority, agencies report that \$48,212,133 has lapsed and is unavailable for expenditure. Agencies report that \$271,268,119 in funds have been obligated, but not yet expended, and \$5,556,530 in funds remain available for obligation and expenditure.
