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


Agency Budget and Policy Issues and/or Highlights

Recommendations for 2022-23 are increased in order to fund up to the agency's General Revenue/General-revenue Dedicated limit of \$27.8 million. The increase from 2020-21 is due to savings in the base greater than the 5 percent reduction.
