## Spotlight: Top 100 Federal Funding Sources

In the 2006–07 biennium, appropriated Federal Funds total \$48.3 billion and make up 35 percent of the state budget. Improvement in Federal Funds to Texas can be demonstrated by comparing the relative growth of Federal Funds within the state budget. In fiscal year 1983, Federal Funds made up less than one-fifth of the budget. Growth in Federal Funds has averaged 9.7 percent per year for the previous 22 years. Awards from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services accounted for 53.0 percent of all federal grant expenditures in Texas in federal fiscal year 2004.

This week the Legislative Budget Board issued a new edition of the *Top 100 Federal Funding Sources in the Texas State Budget*. A description for each funding source includes the purpose of the grant, information on how federal allocations to states are determined, match or maintenance of effort provisions, selected information on allowable federal uses or restrictions, and eligibility criteria. The recipient state agency is listed, and if grants are shared by multiple agencies a chart showing the proportionate share of funds is provided.
