



Supreme Court of Texas Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues

- 1. Appellate Court Operations MOF swap of Supreme Court Support Fee revenues. The Court made a rider request to appropriate all fee revenues from the Supreme Court Support Fee. The 80th Legislature enacted SB 1182 authorizing a \$50 filing fee to be deposited into the Supreme Court Subaccount of Judicial Fund No. 573. The Court had estimated appropriation authority (approximately \$200,000 per year) for this fee in 2008–09 from Article IX, Sec. 19.101. The Court did not request an appropriating rider in 2010–11 for all fees, and this revenue source is fixed in the 2010–11 GAA at \$138,465 per year. The Court will request approximately \$70,000 in the 2010–11 Supplemental Appropriations Bill. The Introduced Bill provides the Court with a rider providing estimated appropriation authority of \$200,000 per year (see Rider No. 8), which would allow them to access all Supreme Court Support fee revenues. The appropriation increase in Supreme Court Support fee receipts over 2010–11 levels is \$123,070 (\$61,535 per year). Finally, the Introduced Bill reduces GR for the Court (Strategy A.1.1, Appellate Court Operations) by \$123,070 (\$61,535 per year), which is offset by the appropriations increase of the same amount from Supreme Court Support fee receipts.
- 2. One-time funding for Basic Civil Legal Service (BCLS) to offset Interest on Lawyers Trust Account (IOLTA) shortfall. The Eighty-first Legislature added \$20 million (\$10 million each year) of GR funding to offset the projected IOLTA shortfall in the 2010–11 biennium. IOLTA funds are outside of the GAA but serve as a revenue source for BCLS funding. The decline was due to historically low interest rates of approximately 0.25 percent. The Eighty-first Legislature added Rider 8 to the Court's bill pattern identifying this \$20 million as a one-time measure. The Texas Access to Justice Foundation (TAJF), who administers the BCLS Program on behalf of the Court, is continuing to project low IOLTA revenues in the 2012–13 biennium, and the Court has requested the \$20 million be restored as part of its exceptional items request. (See the attached spreadsheet titled Funding Sources for BCLS, which highlights the sources of funding for BCLS both within and outside the GAA.)
- 3. **BCLS** revenues from new fee. The Eighty-first Legislature enacted House Bill 3637 which increased filing fees in civil actions from \$5 to \$10 in district or county courts and from \$2 to \$6 in justice courts, as of January 1, 2010, to increase revenues for Basic Civil Legal Services. While there is not a full year's worth of data on the new fee revenue, the current projection from the Court and Texas Access to Justice Foundation (TAJF) is an additional \$1.38 million per fiscal year. The Introduced Bill removes General Revenue previously appropriated for BCLS services of \$1.425 million per year, which will be (at least partially) offset by the revenue gain to Judicial Fund No. 573 due to the passage of HB 3637.
- 4. **Multi-District Litigation.** The Introduced Bill funds MDL grants in an amount near the level of existing yearly obligations times two. As of September 2010, there was only one grant recipient, a court hearing asbestos-related MDL case in Harris County. The grant funds salaries for one court coordinator (\$73,645 annual salary), one court clerk (\$41,980 annual salary), and legal research and office supplies (\$2,400). The Fiscal Year 2011 grant award for this court case totals \$118,025. The Introduced Bill applies a 2.3% reduction to the 2011 award, which represents the average reduction to the Court Operations strategies of all 16 appellate courts (The Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeals, and the 14 Courts of Appeals). The salary for the judge hearing the cases is funded out of the appropriations at the Comptroller's Judiciary for the Visiting Judge Program.

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Supreme Court of Texas Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues

- 5. **Texas Young Lawyers License Plate revenue.** The Introduced Bill funds license plate revenues to Judicial Fund No. 573 for BCLS purposes at 50% of projected levels. (See Rider Highlights No. 6).
- 6. **Legal Reference Materials for the Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals.** The Bill as Introduced maintains \$192,144 (\$96,072 per year) in GR funding to continue purchases of legal reference materials for the Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals. The Law Library has historically purchased legal reference materials for both of the State's top two appellate courts. The Introduced Bill funds legal reference materials at the amount the Law Library expended in 2010 (\$55,269 for the Supreme Court and \$40,803 at the Court of Criminal Appeals). Funds are appropriated in each court's Appellate Court Operations Strategy and the funding is restricted by rider for legal reference purposes (see Rider 13 in CCA bill pattern).

Rider is consistent with recommendation to reduce GR funding for court operations and offset reduction with additional Supreme Court Support fee receipts.
