2012-2013 BIENNIUM IN MILLIONS

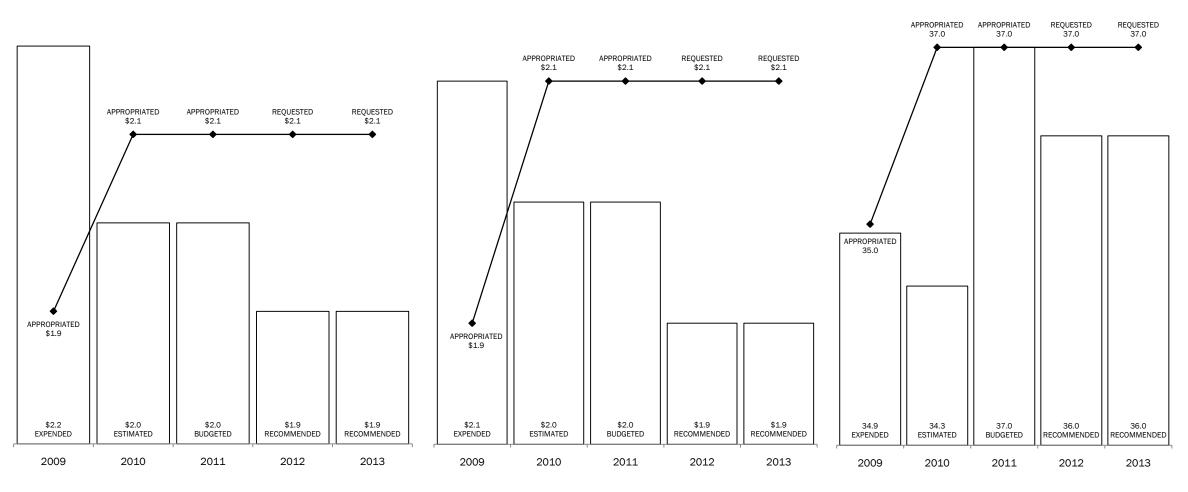

Texas Ethics Commission Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues

Fiscal Implications of LBB Recommendations

- Recommendations to eliminate the agency's ethics education program and the corresponding 1 FTE would result in
 agencies taking on additional responsibility, without any additional appropriations, to provide ethics-related
 educational material to their employees. Government Code, Section 571.071, contains a statutory requirement that
 the Ethics Commission, in cooperation with state agencies, shall provide a program of ethics training for state
 employees.
- Recommendations include \$187,500 in General Revenue each fiscal year that is contingent on a statutory change
 that would increase the fees collected by the agency sufficient to generate \$375,000 in excess of the amount
 contained in Object Code 3175 in the Comptroller's 2012-13 Biennial Revenue Estimate.

• Increase of certain fees collected by the agency – Government Code, Section 305.005.

Texas Ethics Commission Rider Highlights

- 2. (new) **Judgments and Settlements.** Add rider that would exempt the agency from Article IX, Section 16.02, relating to judgments and settlements. That provision states that, in the event of a judgment or settlement, the payer agency is liable for payment up to a maximum of 10 percent of its appropriations for that particular fiscal year. Currently, the agency is the named party defending the State in actions based on free speech claims brought under Title 42, United States Code, Section 1983. The recommendations are for the Comptroller to directly pay these costs rather than the Ethics Commission, whose budget would not be able to absorb the costs of a judgment or settlement related to civil rights under Title 42, United States Code, Section 1983.
- 2. (old) Capital Budget. Delete rider to reflect that recommendations do not include capital budget projects for 2012-13.
- 3. (new) **Contingent Revenue.** Add rider to reflect recommendation that \$187,500 of the agency's annual General Revenue appropriation is contingent on the Legislature enacting legislation that increases the fees the agency collects sufficient to generate \$375,000 in excess of the amount contained in Object Code 3175 in the Comptroller's 2012-13 Biennial Revenue Estimate.
