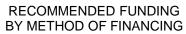
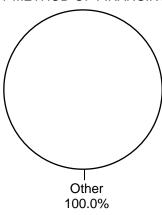

2012-2013 BIENNIUM IN MILLIONS

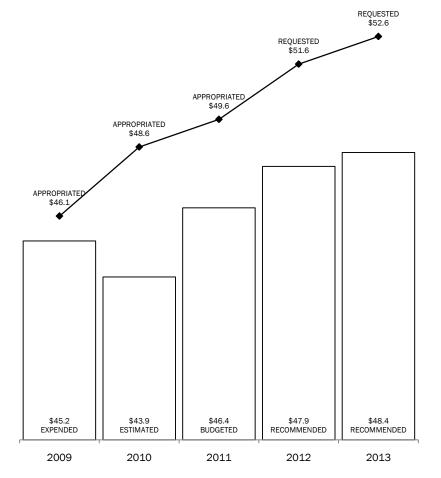

Recommendations provide primarily for payments for medical expenses (\$56.0 million) and compensation indemnity payments (\$34.2 million) and allow for an increase in the medical fee schedule and average weekly wage (\$2.0 million) and an increase due to restrictions put on informal networks (\$4.0 million).

### Workers' Compensation Payments Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues

#### **Fiscal Implications of LBB Recommendations:**

1. **House Bill 473, 80<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session.** House Bill 473, 80<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session, puts restrictions on informal networks resulting in the elimination of SORM's ability to accept discounts for Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) and Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM). As of January 1, 2011, SORM is no longer able to accept discounted fees for medical services through informal or voluntary networks for PPOs. Based on an emergency ruling by the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation, the ability to accept PBM discounts has been extended for a maximum of 180 days beyond January 1, 2011.

SORM currently contracts with a vendor that provides access to a voluntary PPO providing approximately \$2.0 million in annual savings to the state through contractual discounts. SORM also contracts with a PBM providing approximately \$1.0 million in negotiated annual savings to the state. The loss of these savings would result in an increase in assessments to state agencies of approximately \$6.0 million per biennium or a 6.8 percent increase above 2010-11 levels.
