New rider to provide for coordination between agencies to use and analyze data from the federal Public Assistance and Reporting Information System (PARIS) to generate savings for the state. | Informational Listing General Obligation Bond Proceeds. Existing informational rider which will be updated with approved general obligation bond and debt service amounts. | <b>Reduction for Employee Benefits.</b> New rider to provide reductions to amounts appropriated elsewhere in the Act to reflect the elimination of payroll growth for general state employees and employees of institutions of higher education. | Reductions Related to Data Center Services. New rider to provide reductions to amounts appropriated elsewhere in the Act for the purpose of making payments for data center services provided by the Department of Information Resources. | Disaster Related Transfer Authority. Amended existing rider to provide greater clarity. | Limitations on Expenditures - Capital Budget. Amended existing rider to provide clarity when the rider applies to an agency that does not have a governing board; to change the capital budget item threshold amount from \$25,000 to \$100,000; and to allow the transfer of items of appropriation from capital budget items to non-capital items with LBB/Governor approval. | Appropriation Transfers. Amended existing rider to allow transfers of a maximum of 20 percent between items of appropriation without LBB/Governor approval and an additional request to exceed approval process for amounts in excess of 20 percent. Additionally amended to prohibit transferring into items of appropriation identified as "Indirect Administration" without prior LBB/Governor approval. | Appropriation of Specialty License License Plate Receipts. Moved the rider from Part 17 to Part 13 of Article IX and limit the appropriation to 50 percent of all revenues accrued to state agencies and institution of higher education during the 2012-13 biennium. |

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
