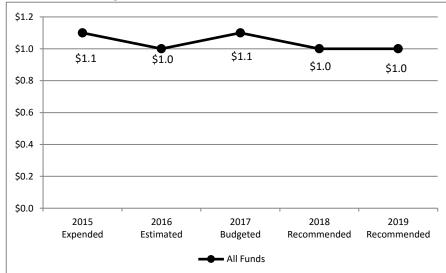

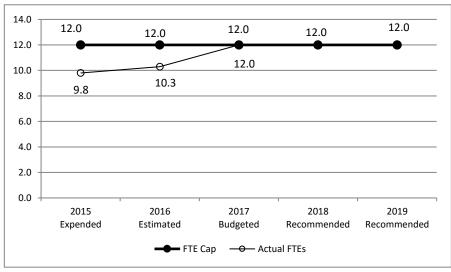

The bill pattern for this agency (2018-19 Recommended) represents an estimated 100% of the agency's estimated total available funds for the 2018-19 biennium.

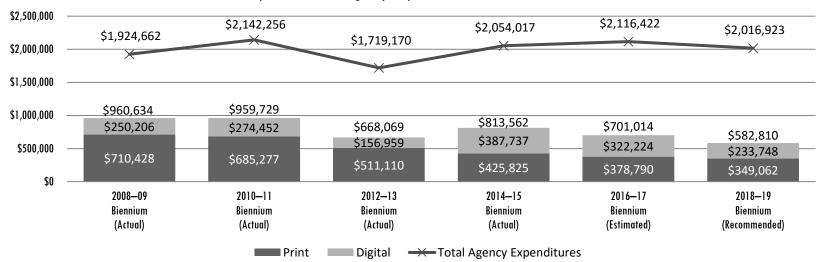

## State Law Library Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate

1. **Legal Publication Expenses:** Recommendations include \$582,810 in General Revenue for the purchase of print and digital legal reference materials. These costs represent a regular expense of the State Law Library to maintain the currency of the library's collection. Funding to meet these costs are frequent exceptional item requests for the agency. According to library staff, expenditures for traditional print reference materials have steadily decreased over time due to budget reductions and the library's recent transition to providing digital resources. Over this same time, costs per title for library materials has consistently increased. For example, the average cost of serial publications that are issued on an ongoing basis increased by 47.6 percent between fiscal years 2010 and 2014 and the cost of annual supplements have increased by 30.1 percent. The following chart shows the library's print and digital expenses over the past five biennia and recommended amounts for 2018–19 as compared to total agency expenditures.



Due to these annual increases and because of fluctuations in the agency's budget; the State Law Library does not update every reference title every year. Instead, the Library negotiates multi-year contracts with publishers in return for the publisher holding price increases at a consistent rate. Despite these cost-saving measures, the Library has had to cancel subscriptions to many law journals and library periodicals, going from 60 titles in Fiscal Year 2008 to offering six in fiscal year 2017 and canceled 23 print reference titles and 300 digital reference titles for fiscal year 2017 (See also, Items Not Included in Recommendations - Senate #1 and #2).

#### **Modified Riders**

- 2. **Appropriation of Receipts: Fees and Service Charges:** Recommendations reduce Appropriated Receipts amounts from collected fees and service charges for duplication services to the inmates of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice from \$18,750 to \$12,950 each year to align with anticipated library collections in the 2016–17 biennium.
- 3. Interagency Document Delivery and Library Services: Recommendations reduce Interagency Contract amounts from duplication services for other state agencies and courts from \$500 to \$50 each year to align with interagency contract receipts in the 2016–17 biennium.
