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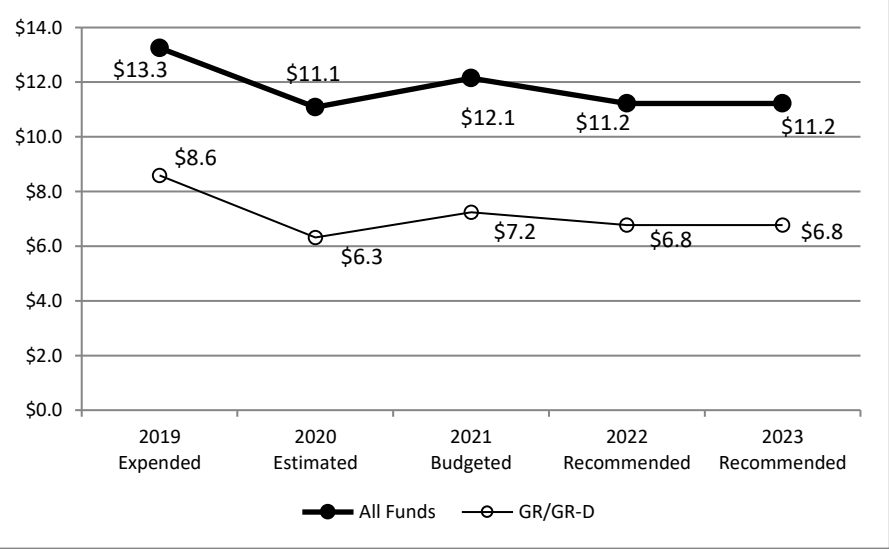

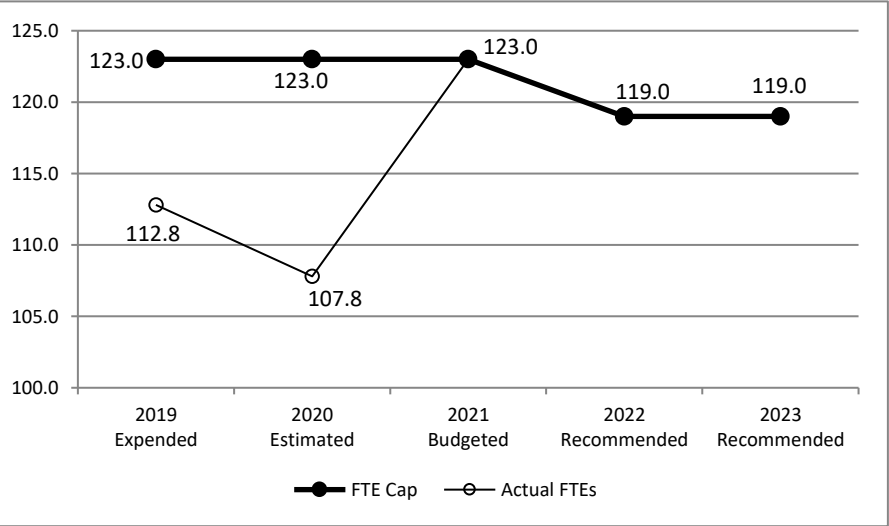

Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate**

1. **Decrease to Appropriated Receipts and Interagency Contracts.** Funding changes include a decrease of \$780,000 in Other Funds, a result of agency-estimated adjustments to Appropriated Receipts and Interagency Contracts. SOAH uses the Appropriated Receipts fund to coordinate the purchase of hearing transcripts, and Interagency Contracts to provide for lump-sum contracts based on projected workload.
2. **Administrative Case Tracking System (ACTS) Ongoing Maintenance.** SOAH will implement a new ACTS document management system in 2021 utilizing funds provided by the 84th Legislature. The ACTS contract requires \$200,000 in annual fees to be paid directly to the ACTS vendor - \$125,000 for annual maintenance costs and \$75,000 for annual cloud storage. Recommendations do not include \$125,000 in General Revenue funds per year requested by the agency to fulfill the annual maintenance portion of the contract.

Rider Highlights - Senate**

Modification of Existing Riders

2. **Capital Budget.** Recommendations include a decrease of capital budget authority totaling \$85,260 in General Revenue. This includes a decrease of \$150,000 for IT acquisition authority, and an increase of \$64,740 for Data Center Services.
5. **Hearings Activity Report.** Recommendations include the removal of the requirement to track the number of administrative fine cases disposed as this reporting element is no longer consistent with agency performance measures and is unable to be captured in the Administrative Case Tracking System.
7. **Billing Rate for Workload.** Recommendations include reordering specified list of agencies that do not have appropriations for paying SOAH costs for administrative hearings and are not subject to the default billing rate.
