


Agency Budget and Policy Issues and/or Highlights

Commission on Fire Protection Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate

- 1. **Restoration of the Five Percent Budget Reduction:** The agency requests as the first exceptional item the restoration of the 2020-21 five percent budget reduction. The agency's LAR submission included a budgeted reduction for the 2020-21 biennium of only two and a half percent; recommendations take the remaining two and a half percent from the base. The agency indicates that the reduction impacts their ability to carry out their mandated mission.
- 2. **Strategic Fiscal Review:** The agency is currently under Strategic Fiscal Review (SFR) for the Eighty-seventh Legislative Session. One of the SFR recommendations is to revisit the pass through funding arrangement for the Texas State Fire Fighters Scholarship Fund. SFR recommendations also include updating statute to include processes currently outlined in agency rules and increasing accessibility to online certification programs.
- 3. **Sunset Review:** The Sunset Advisory Commission reviewed the agency as part of its 2020-21 review cycle for the Eighty-seventh Legislative Session and recommends the continuation of Texas Commission on Fire Protection for another twelve years, until 2033. Sunset's Staff Report identified two issues for which it made recommendations. Sunset staff found that the agency could improve effectiveness and transparency, and could update statute and operations to reflect regulatory best practices. The Sunset Advisory Commission adopted all of the Sunset staff's recommendations in January 2021.
