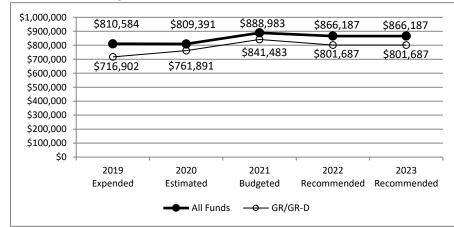

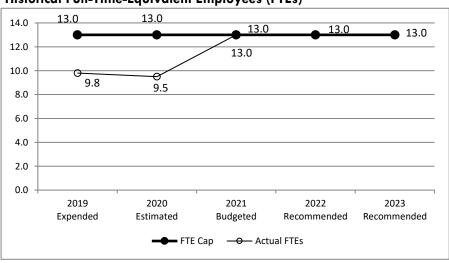

Board of Chiropractic Examiners Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate

- 1. **COVID-19 Impact on Revenues:** According to the agency, the new licensee application process has slowed as applicants cannot take Part IV of their National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE) exams. This affects revenue collection of application fees, pro-rated licensing fees, and jurisprudence exam fees. Many chiropractic offices were closed March-May affecting the ability to take continuing education hours and renew licenses, which therefore affects the revenue collection of license renewal fees.
- 2. Office of the Governor's Fee Reduction Initiative. In October 2019, the Office of the Governor sent a letter to executive branch agencies to develop plans to reduce occupational license fees to at least 75 percent of the national average for comparable or equivalent licenses. The agency estimates that reducing license fees for their licenses would result in a loss of excess fees returned to General Revenue of \$25,000 per biennium compared to current levels. The agency does not request any funding related to this item.
